1. AUSCP Origins



The Association of U.S. Catholic Priests (AUSCP) was founded in 2011 by twentyseven priests from 11 states at St. Mary's Seminary in Mundelein, Illinois. The Association promotes change inside and outside the Catholic Church.¹

Our Vision: To be a Priest's Voice of Hope and Joy within our Pilgrim Church.

Members state that, "We are inspired by the teaching of Vatican II and support the continuing pursuit of its implementation." They founded the Association "because they saw a crucial need for a national forum for the nation's priests." AUSCP is based on individual membership where every priest has a vote. The Association has held six national assemblies since 2012, and reportedly has grown to as many as 1,200 members.²

AUSCP cites the dramatic decline in the number of priests as a primary reason why the Association came into existence. AUSCP points to the downward trend of diocesan and religious priests, many of them elderly and toward the end of their ministering lives. They are disturbed by the escalating number of laypeople per priest, the

declining number of priests per parish, and the increasing number of resident "priestless parishes".³

2. AUSCP Leadership

During 2016-2017, the Association's leadership team and officers consisted of thirteen members (five team officers and eight others). On June 22, 2017, AUSCP members at the Sixth Annual AUSCP Assembly elected a new leadership team. The Leadership Core Team Officers for 2017-2018 are listed in the following table. During the welcome address of the 2013 AUSCP Assembly, Jackie O'Ryan, a Seattle-based communications and public affairs consultant, was introduced as the group's new managing director.⁵ It is unknown if Ms. O'Ryan continues in that position because Faith Action Network (FAN) announced that she had taken the position of FAN Co-Director sometime in 2017.⁶

3. AUSCP Goals & Resolutions

Since its inception in 2011, AUSCP has presented various lists of goals and resolutions at annual assemblies. The following excerpt from the National Catholic Reporter⁷ (NCR) presents a representative list of topics of importance to the Association in 2013.

The assembly will address the slate of 15 resolutions during its business sessions, Cooper told *NCR*. He added that a prioritizing effort was underway and it was possible that not all 15 could be considered at the Seattle meeting.

In addition to study of the expansion of ordination, a call for general absolution reinstatement, and an appeal for transparency and local consultation on the selection of bishops, the resolutions also:

- Call for the exercise of church authority to be carried out "in a collegial manner," employing "a consensus decision making process."
- Direct the association to "ask the Holy Father to grant permission to use the 1974 edition of the Sacramentary in the United States where desired."
- Ask the association to support "a comprehensive plan for evangelization in the U.S.A.," including "diagnosis" of reasons Catholics have left the church and study of Christian churches that have seen rapid growth.
- Request that the organization invite the U.S. bishops' conference to appoint a liaison to the association.
- Call for the Seattle meeting's assembly to "decry the annual collection for the Archdiocese for Military Service for its rendering to Caesar what is to be rendered to God."

Much of the coordination, planning, and development of the goals and resolutions is conducted by the following eleven AUSCP "working groups": (See <u>Appendix C</u> for details.)

- Immigration,
- Roman Missal Translation Concerns,
- National Plan for Priestless Parishes,
- Re-Commitment to Gospel Non-Violence,
- Elimination of Racism,
- Ordination of Married Men (Viri probati),
- AUSCP Membership Diversity,
- Bridges to the Laity,
- Caring for our Common Home (Laudato Si'),
- Church and Labor, and
- Emerging Pastoral Issues.

The goals and resolutions prepared for presentation at the 2017 AUSCP Assembly were previewed by both the Voice of the Faithful (VOTF) and AUSCP on their respective Websites. Although the two versions agree in most respects, the VOTF version provides more detail. There are notable differences in emphasis and concern when the 2017 list is compared with the 2013 list.

PRIEST-LESS PARISHES : Approve at the Assembly the letter to be sent to all US Bishops on Priest-less Parishes. Sacramental Anointing: A second resolution concerns the Catholic practice of the Sacrament of Anointing – part of what previous generations often referred to as the "Last Rites." The priests say many hospital patients are being denied this sacrament because of inadequate priest-chaplain coverage. If adopted, the resolution would ask the U.S. bishops "to petition the Holy See for Deacons to administer the Sacrament of Anointing."	

4. AUSCP Networking

As noted in Section 3, VOTF is closely aligned with AUSCP. Likewise, FutureChurch, an organization that "seeks changes that will provide all Roman Catholics the opportunity to participate fully in the Church life and leadership", is the third member of closely knit trio of organizations. An example of this tripartite relationship is DeaconChat,⁸ a "joint initiative of the Association of U.S. Catholic Priests, FutureChurch, and Voice of the Faithful" with the goal "to bring the ordained and the laity together in conversation to continue to learn and discern together" with regard to opening ordination to the deaconate to women.

AUSCP maintains close ties with several "related" and "other organizations inspired by Vatican II." (Please refer to <u>Appendix D-1</u> and <u>Appendix D-4</u> for details.)

The many relationships AUSCP maintains with similarly thinking groups are not confined to the United States. AUSCP also maintains working relationships with at least three international priest organizations. (Please refer to <u>Appendix D-2</u> for details.)

AUSCP maintains a loose association with the International Church Reform Network (ICRN). In the ICRN way of thinking, "Networking means that everybody is self-responsible for their action. Yet we are connected and sometimes cooperate for certain events, publications or happenings. If appropriate we ask each other for solidarity."

A gathering of ICRN associated groups took place in October 2016 in Chicago. The conference was hosted by AUSCP, FutureChurch, and VOTF, once again demonstrating the close alliance of the three organizations. Appendix C – AUSCP Working Groups as of July 5, 2017

AUSCP Working Groups as of July 5, 2017¹²

Immigration

Purpose: To inform members about Immigration issues and to support the efforts of the USCCB to promote and advance Comprehensive Immigration Reform thru public actions and support of positive initiatives.

Roman Missal Translation Concerns

Purpose: To collect and voice the complaints of priests and laity about the awkward grammar and diction of the new Roman Missal's "English translation" so as to move the USCCB Committee for Divine Worship to hear the concern and take steps to improve the texts used for our most important liturgical prayer.

National Plan for Priestless Parishes

Purpose: To express alarm at the lack of a clear, realistic and viable plan to provide pastoral leadership in priestless parishes and to research and, with others, formulate a proposal for presentation to the USCCB.

<u>Re-Commitment to Gospel Non-Violence</u>

Purpose: To invite and occasion personal and organizational re-commitment to Gospel Non-Violence in response to the "Appeal to the Catholic Church" issued in April, 2016 by the Vatican's Pontifical Council for Justice and Peace together with Pax Christi International.

Elimination of Racism

Purpose: To advance the elimination of racism in our church by fostering interracial dialogue, inter-faith exchange, homiletic resources and parish prayer service models, and the formation of friendship with people from various racial backgrounds.

Ordination of Married Men (Viri probati)

Purpose: To encourage the American Bishops to petition the Pope to change the present law requiring celibacy of all Roman Catholic priests by opening ordination to married men of proven quality (*viri probati*).

AUSCP Membership Diversity

Purpose: To develop a more diverse AUSCP membership in terms of race, ethnicity, age, and geography. Associated objectives include similar diversity of speakers, facilitators, and forms of prayer and worship; liaisons with national ethnic priests associations and individual bishops; and responses to diversity issues in church and society.

Bridges to the Laity

Purpose: To define, develop and welcome appropriate involvement of persons and organizations in pursuit of AUSCP's Mission.

<u>Caring for our Common Home (Laudato Si')</u>

Purpose: To promote knowledge and reception of Pope Francis' 2nd encyclical through provision of homily helps for every Sunday of the three year liturgical Sunday and to support other efforts by AUSCP members and others.

Church and Labor

PURPOSE: To foster among priests continuation of the Church's long tradition in the United States of supporting working men and women and to bring the Church's Social Teaching and U.S. Labor Law to bear on one another.

Emerging Pastoral Issues

Purpose: To engage AUSCP members and other priests in dialogue and survey responses aimed at identifying pastoral issues and challenges that are emerging as U.S. society and culture change.

The following are excerpts from the story entitled *"International Catholic Priest Movements and Reform Groups Urge Church Progress on Key Issues during October meeting"* as it appeared on the Women's Ordination Conference Website on October 21, 2016:¹³

From October 17 – 20, 2016, forty priests and lay persons from ten countries gathered in Chicago to develop strategies supporting reform in the Catholic Church. The group called for progress on: full equality for women in the Church; rights for LGBT Catholics; fundamental rights for all Catholics; and developing emerging models of parish ministry such as the Bishop Fritz Lobinger model.

The conference was hosted by FutureChurch, the Association of U.S. Catholic Priests and Voice of the Faithful.
