The Problem:

- NWBCCC runs a youth program called Sistas and Brothas United whose web presence shows support for homosexuality and Marxism.
- NWBCCC is an affiliate of National People's Action.
 - NPA signed a letter to Congress and President Obama urging them to "stand against any effort to defund Planned Parenthood."
- Its president is publicly in support of homosexual rights.

The Response:

After contacting the local diocese with initial findings in July, American Life League received a letter dated 31 July 2012. In the letter, Monsignor Kevil Sullivan said:

"After the most recent review of their CCHD grant request, prior to your letter, the NWBCC was not recommended for funding, and will not be receiving money from the Catholic Campaign for Human Development."

American Life League has taken this to mean that NWBCCC did receive its full grant for the 2011-2012 grant cycle, but as the new grant request for the 2012-2013 grant cycle was being reviewed, the Archdiocese of New York denied the application and has barred it from future funding.

The following information on the leadership of NWBCCC is included in this report because in January of 2012, Bishop Jamie Soto, Chairman of the CCHD, defunded an organization called Francis House as a direct result of its executive director's support for abortion and same-sex "marriage." Even though the executive director claimed that she never gave support for these things in her capacity as the leader of Francis House, Bishop Soto saw fit to defund the organization anyway. This slide contains the pertinent aspects of the story.

Sacramento Catholic Diocese drops funds over nonprofit director's views



The Catholic Diocese of Sacramento no longer will fund programs at Francis House, a nonprofit agency that serves homeless people, because of its new director's views supporting abortion rights and gay marriage.

In a letter last month, the diocese's director of social services said the <u>Rev. Faith Whitmore's public statements</u> on the issues clash with the teachings of the Catholic Church. Therefore, said the Rev. Michael Kiernan, the social services director, it is "impossible for the diocese to continue funding Francis House" as part of its annual Catholic Appeal.

Within her own denomination, she has been a strong advocate of same-sex marriage. In 2008, during a short period in which gay marriage was legal in California, Whitmore openly defied church law by marrying same-sex couples. She has said publicly that she supports a woman's right to obtain an abortion.

"I have never represented any of those positions on behalf of Francis House," said Whitmore, formerly the senior pastor at St. Mark's United Methodist Church. "I was speaking as an individual. So for me, this came out of the blue."

Bishop Jaime Soto approved of the decision to stop funding Francis House, said Eckery.







History: From the Socialist Scholars to the Left Forum

Left Forum developed out of the Socialist Scholars Conference (SSC). The first SSC in 1981 was actually the re-founding by Bogdan Denitch, Stanley Aronowitz and others of the 1960s Socialist Scholars Conference. The earlier conference was a broad effort by new left academics to create a forum in which to present theoretical and historical work, for the most part in a scholarly format but with an audience reaching far beyond academic circles.

Practically every major socialist thinker appeared at one time or another at the SSC, and many international unionists and political officials. By 2000, after

The keynote speaker for the 2010 conference was Rev. Jesse Jackson. The final plenary featured Noam Chomsky, and included a tribute to Howard Zinn from Arundhati Roy and Frances Fox Piven, along with a performance of Zinn's play "Marx in Soho." The Zinn tribute and Chomsky's appearance drew the expected enormous crowds, with people lining up around the block.

Did you know that under the Affordable Care Act, women's preventive health care services — such as mammograms, screenings for cervical cancer, and other services — will be covered 100% with NO co-pays or deductibles? Although women on Medicare and many who have insurance through are already enjoying these benefits, all insurance plans will be required to provide preventive health services without co-pays or deductibles starting <u>August 1, 2012</u>.

The women's preventive health services required under the Act are:

Standing FIRM for All Families: FIRM calls for LGBT inclusion

In 2010, as a member of FIRM, the Gamaliel Foundation added its voice to FIRM's call for LGBT inclusion in immigration reform.

<u>Today, the Fair Immigration Reform Movement</u>, a coalition of grassroots organizations, <u>released the following statement calling for LGBT inclusion in comprehensive immigration reform</u>:

This statement from FIRM makes abundantly clear the intention of the entire organization, and its members, to include homosexual activism in immigration reform.

FIRM Statement on Uniting American Families Act (UAFA)

We are moved by stories of bi-national couples who are fighting to keep their families together amidst a broken immigration system. Thousands of bi-national couples who identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender (LGBT) are at risk of separation. With no clear pathway towards legalization nor federal recognition of same-sex couples, these couples live constantly in a state of fear or exile.

We believe that keeping families together should be an integral part of comprehensive immigration reform. We believe that we strengthen our communities and our nation when we support the right of all families to stay together, including LGBT families.

This is why we support the Uniting American Families Act (UAFA). UAFA would add the term "permanent partner" to those sections of the Immigration and Naturalization Act that apply to legally married couples. Under UAFA, a "permanent partner" is an adult who is in a committed, intimate relationship with another adult in "which both parties intend a lifelong commitment." This legislation would afford equal immigration benefits to permanent partnerships as exist for married heterosexuals.

While we believe that comprehensive immigration reform will benefit lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBT) immigrants, we recognize that the intersection of migration, sexuality and gender expression impact LGBT immigrants in disparate ways. Issues of detention, deportation and asylum are not only issues of dignity for LGBT immigrants, but often also issues of safety. We must remember these experiences in the struggle for immigration reform.

We need solidarity across movements in order to build the power necessary to achieve justice for all our communities. Such solidarity means that we recognize the multiple ways that people across lines of race, class, gender, sexuality, and ability experience immigration. We must work to build strategic relationships that lift up the most vulnerable among us in the struggle for just and humane immigration reform. This includes the lives and experiences of LGBT immigrants.

Marissa Graciosa, director of FIRM, says:

"There is power in our diversity, but we must honor that diversity. And it starts with keeping all families from all backgrounds together. This is why we support the Uniting American Families Act."
